The absence of public spaces that nurture togetherness and collective spirit leaves a significant mark on society. Loneliness, depression, and physical inactivity are rising,

particularly in the Nordic countries, where long winters and cultural habits deepen isolation. Research published in Frontiers in Public Health reveals that loneliness among older adults was notably higher in Nordic countries during the COVID-19 pandemic compared to the Baltic states, underscoring regional challenges in social well-being.


At the same time, society is experiencing a profound demographic shift. According to the World Health Organization (WHO), by 2024, individuals over 65 will outnumber those under 15 in the WHO European Region. This aging population defies traditional stereotypes—today's seniors are healthier, wealthier, and more adventurous than their predecessors. A 2024 report by GetSetUp highlights their desire to lead healthier, more fulfilling lives, focusing on holistic health, digital literacy, social connectivity, and financial security.

When we think of public spaces designed for intergenerational connection, images of Mediterranean plazas or Southeast Asian parks may come to mind. These are places where people of all ages gather—playing pétanque, flying kites, practicing yoga and tai chi, or simply enjoying each other's company. Such spaces are alive with energy and reflect a deep cultural understanding of the importance of community in daily life.

In the Nordics, the challenge lies in translating these principles to our unique climate and cultural context. The goal isn't replication but reinvention: creating environments that inspire movement, connection, and joy year-round. This means shifting focus from

products and spaces catering solely to frailty and old age to designs that celebrate vitality and bridge the generational divide.

At NoIa, we believe the outdoors should serve as a lifelong playground a place for discovery, connection, and activity throughout life.








A Fresh Take on the Folkpark

At Stockholm Furniture Fair 2025, Nola presents a contemporary take on the folkpark—a place where community, creativity, and inclusion take centre stage. The exhibit showcases new products alongside a vision for urban spaces that connect generations and inspire togetherness.

The folk park, or "folkparken," is a unique cultural phenomenon that has shaped Swedish society for over a century. Originally established by labor unions and social organizations in the late 19th century, folkparks offered accessible alternatives to the exclusive venues of the upper classes. By the mid-20th century, these parks had become vital hubs of social life, where communities gathered for music, theatre, and dance. For children, they were places of joy and discovery, fostering connections across all ages.

Folkparks were central to public life and togetherness. Here in the North, we may have a reputation for chosing solitude—we prefer sitting alone on the bus and we tend to avoid conversations with strangers. A simple "hej" can be more than enough, and yet say it all. But, given the right opportunity, we open up our hearts and lives. Many times these opportunities are created by spaces. Public spaces for music, activity, food, and performance

create moments where connections flourish. It's the places that bring us together.

Times, however, have changed. Urbanisation, digitalisation, a pandemic and ever evolving lifestyles have reshaped how we interact in public spaces. Many traditional folkparks have disappeared, but their absence raises an important question: how do we create shared spaces for an increasingly fragmented world?

Today, while the state no longer plays the same role in maintaining shared spaces, the need for them remains just as vital. Henrik Edlund, CEO of Nola, reflects:

"We believe in the power of community. With our products and placemaking design, we breathe new life into the ideals of the folkpark. We create urban, contemporary fragments of these spaces, where people meet and memories are made. It's up to us—businesses, designers, and civic actors—to carry this legacy forward."

product development," adds Nola's founder, Agneta Stake.


"This year, we're presenting some of our most popular series, such as Långbordet and Parco—modern embodiments of folkpark ideals—as smaller versions for children. We're also showcasing playful designs like the swing chair Korg Hammock and new products designed specifically for activity throughout life, such as the walking aid Promenad."

Innovative design often sparks new ways of thinking about public spaces. For example, in Folkets Park in Malmö, Nola's colourful urban gym Kebne attracts people of all ages, while in Gothenburg, their bench Access has been transformed into a "dialogue bench," encouraging conversations among strangers.

In recent years, there has been renewed interest in the folkpark as a symbol of community and sustainability. New initiatives have restored

surviving parks into venues for festivals, outdoor cinemas, and markets.

"Design has the unique ability to bridge gaps—between generations, cultures, and communities. By creating spaces that encourage connection and activity, we can counteract the fragmentation of modern life. If we, with and by design, can offer people a sense of warmth, openness, and solidarity, we can push back against the colder societal climate we see not just in Sweden, but across the world," adds Henrik Edlund.

The folkpark remains a powerful symbol of Sweden's egalitarian values and communal spirit. While their role has evolved, Nola's reimagining of the folkpark at Stockholm Furniture Fair celebrates their enduring importance—offering products and ideas that bring the ethos of folkparks to life in modern urban environments.

Albano is a large-scale urban development project in Stockholm that connects the city centre with Stockholm University and the Royal National City Park. The area consists of several buildings designed by BSK Arkitekter and Cedervall, together forming a vibrant knowledge hub for education and research.

Elin Persson, interior architect at LINK Arkitektur, shares insights into the interior design concept and the process behind the project, based on the university's vision for future learning environments:

"Stockholm University wanted attractive spaces where both students and staff would enjoy spending several hours each day. Based on the body's and brain's varying needs throughout the day, we created a concept centred around zones for social interaction, focus, relaxation, reflection, and creativity," says Elin Persson.

Campus Albano comprises several buildings, including buildings 1, 2 and 4, the latter two connected by a social corridor on levels 2 and 3. LINK Arkitektur was responsible for the interior design of the entire 45,000 sqm campus. Every day, the campus welcomes approximately 6,300 full-time students and more than 1,000 staff members.

To meet high standards of durability and sustainability, LINK chose to use outdoor furniture from Nola in the interior environments. The furniture was selected for its playful expression and park-like aesthetic, echoing both the

interior design concept and the inspiration of the architects. In building 1, the design was inspired by the Royal National City Park, while buildings 2 and 4 were based on themes such as clouds, mountains, and landscapes. By bringing outdoor furniture indoors, these concepts are elegantly interwoven and reinforce the project's cohesive narrative.






Aros






Promenad Walking Bar






Parco

The group consists of sleek seating and a streamlined table that are easy to cluster together, making them ideal for compact spaces. The chairs are designed with a swivel function and contouring seats and backrests that provide additional comfort. The products can be mixed and matched to create customised seating arrangements in a variety of indoor and outdoor settings.







Långbordet was created for connecting spaces and people. The table and seats adapt easily to different types of environments, where they can provide space for community meals, gatherings and youth activities. The system is expandable, able to follow pavement patterns, extend lengthways, arc into circles, or create curving shapes. The benches attach to the table at ground level, ensuring they remain in place at all times. The gaps between individual benches provide spaces for wheelchair users and access points for people of all ages and abilities.









The Four Seasons sun parasol is a sturdy year-round design that deflects the sun and provides shelter from the rain. Made from pieces of sheet steel circling around a steel post, the base bolts securely to the ground. Designed with a striking profile that tilts away from the base, this umbrella adds a contemporary element to city gardens, open courtyards or any environment where shelter and shade are needed.



Elbin's wide opening makes it easy to place rubbish inside. It empties almost as easily; as the door unlocks and pivots open, the metal ring holding the waste bag slides outward to be emptied in one easy movement. The low height of the opening makes it more accessible to wheelchair uses and children. Elbin can be wall-mounted or attached to the ground and ordered in three different sizes. A version with an integrated ashtray is also available.




